

At the beginning of 2025, the Center for Interdisciplinary Latinamerican Research (ILZ), together with its European partners, began work on the "Erasmus+ project LIT-FUTURE" (Literature to change the future: promoting narratives and spaces for eco-social change from universities), funded by the EU.

The aim of LIT-FUTURE is to develop innovative and transnational digital educational tools that



analyse the narrative worlds of climate fiction, anthropocene poetics, and ecoliterature. This should deepen knowledge of the diverse causes and effects of the current eco-social crises and at the same time strengthen the role of universities in promoting sustainability, combating the climate crisis, and ecological change. The project is interdisciplinary in nature. The topics covered are examined from literary, sociological, and anthropological perspectives.

To achieve these goals, the project is pursuing various information and research initiatives that are being carried out at the cooperating universities: University of Murcia (Spain), Stockholm University (Sweden), University of Bonn (Germany), University of Leuven (Belgium), and the University of Salerno (Italy).
